

Movement Disorder Specialists and General Neurologists in Central New Mexico and Neighboring States

A Movement Disorder Specialist is a neurologist with 1-2 years additional training in treating Parkinson's. About 75% of their caseload is people with Parkinson's while a general neurologist has a Parkinson's caseload of about 20%. Both can diagnose and treat the disease, but a specialist is preferred especially when multiple medications are needed or surgical treatments should be considered.

- Are there lifestyle changes that can help my PD?
- Who would you suggest for a second opinion? A reputable doctor will not be offended.

Is your doctor right for you? (You'll be seeing your neurologist many times over the years. It's important to have one that you can communicate with.)

- Are you comfortable speaking with your doctor?
- Do you feel respected by your doctor?
- Are questions answered to your satisfaction?
- Can you get in touch with the doctor between visits?
- Does your doctor have a backup doctor in his/her absence?

While the situation is improving, there is still a shortage of movement disorder specialists in New Mexico, so receiving care from a specialist in nearby states can be an option. To lessen the frequency of out of state trips, a specialist may be willing to develop and annually update a plan of care that's carried out through more frequent visits to a local neurologist, internist, or primary care physician.
